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How to install the Powerband RFX75 on Uniden Bearcat 880

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
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
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RFX75 Installation on the Uniden Bearcat 880

- 1. Confirm that the radio works properly before attempting this modification! Once you have confirmed that the radio works properly remove the top and bottom covers and proceed to the step 2.
- 2. Remove the following parts: L100, L200, L201, L204, Final Transistor (2SC2078). Also remove the chip capacitors that are pointed out in Figure 1. There are 4 chip capacitors total that are removed.




- 3. Next install a jumper wire in place of L200 (see Figure 2)
- 4. Solder the RFX75 red coax center conductor to the jumper that you installed at L200. Solder the shield to ground as in Figure 2.



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5. Route the RFX75 orange wire and yellow coax cable thru the hole where the final was removed and solder them on the back of the board as shown in figure 3.



- 6. Solder the red and black wires from the RFX75 to the back of the radio's DC input jack (not shown).
- 7. Cut the blue wire, yellow wire, and the solid black coax off the RFX75.
- 8. Drill and mount the RFX75 to the back of the radio.
- 9. Optional: You can remove the limiter by deleting D201 (shown in Figure 1) since there is no adjustment for the AMC.
- 10. After confirming that you have finished all steps properly test the RX and TX and retune as needed.

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
